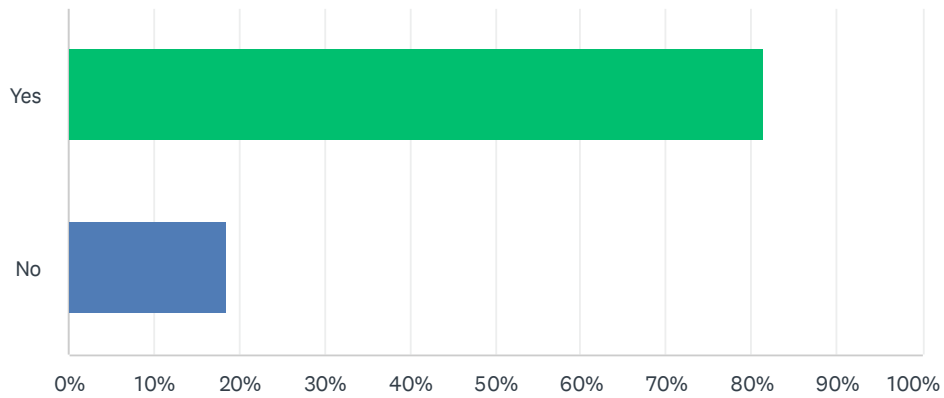

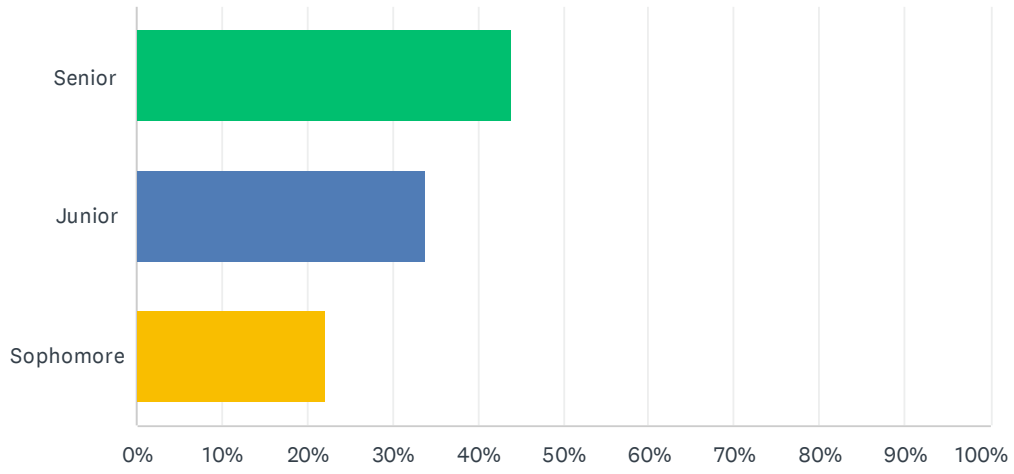

## Q2 What year are you in high school?

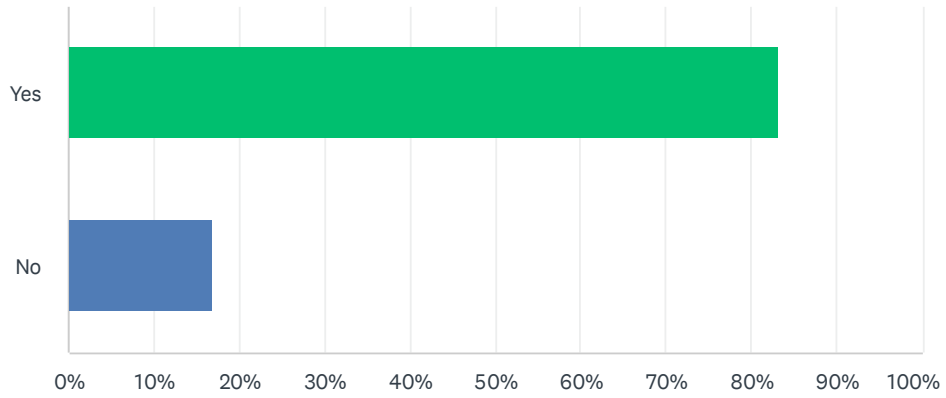

### Q3 Did your high school close due to COVID-19?

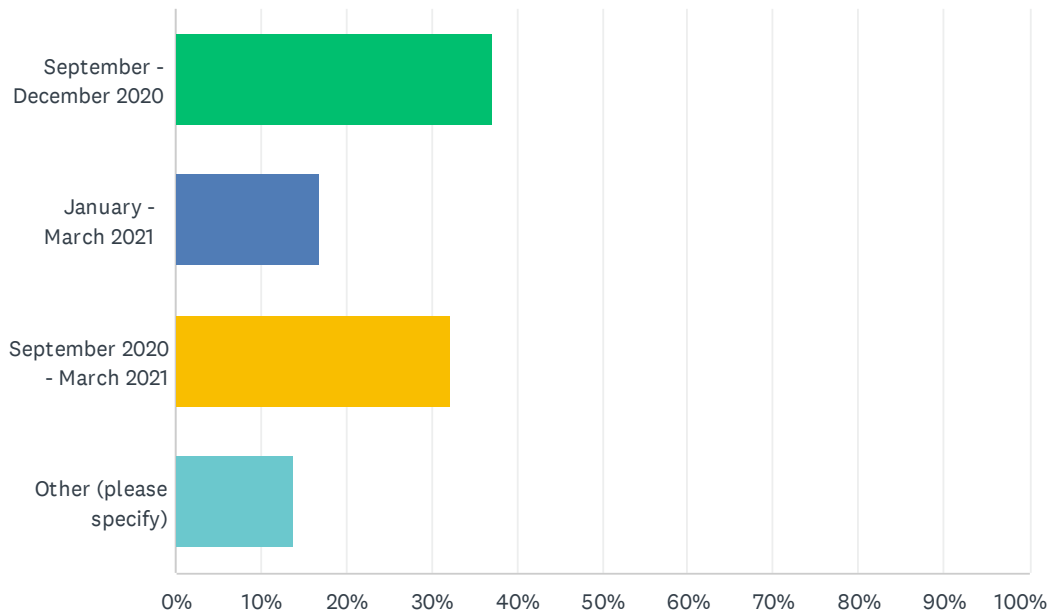

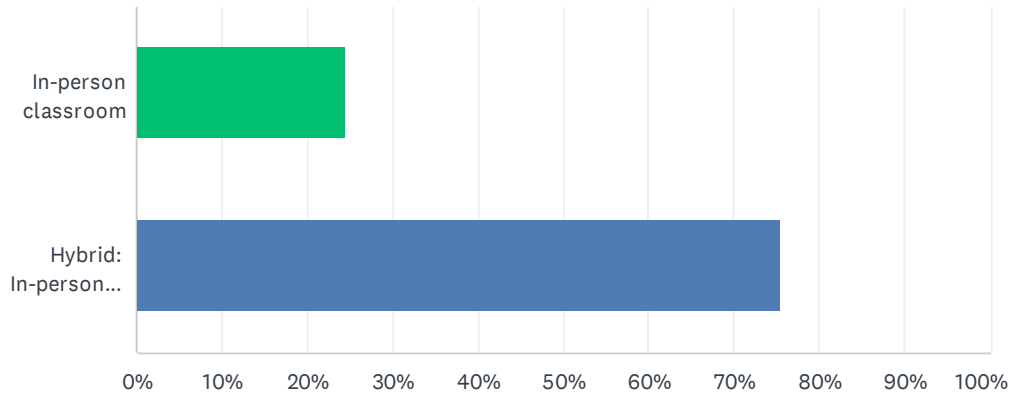

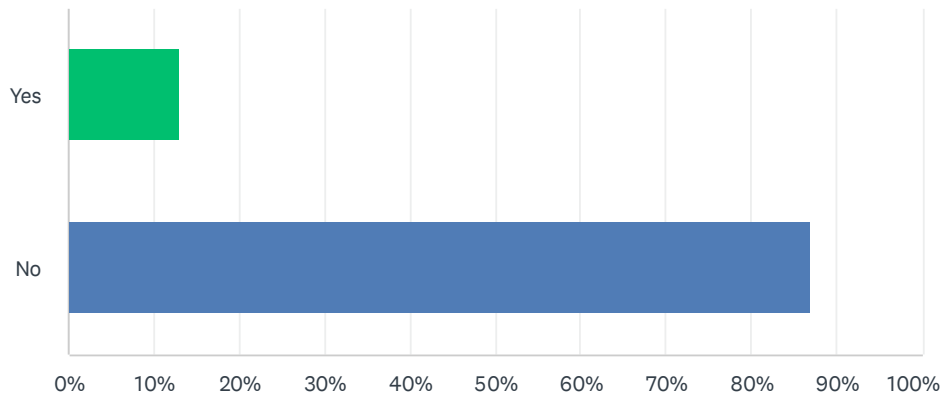

## Q7 When your school closed did you switch to attend a private school?

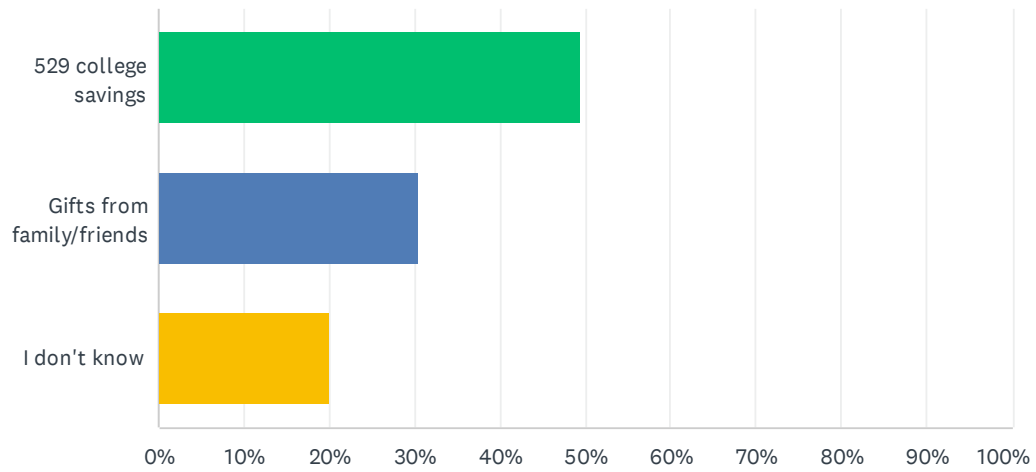

## Q8 If so, how did your parents fund it?

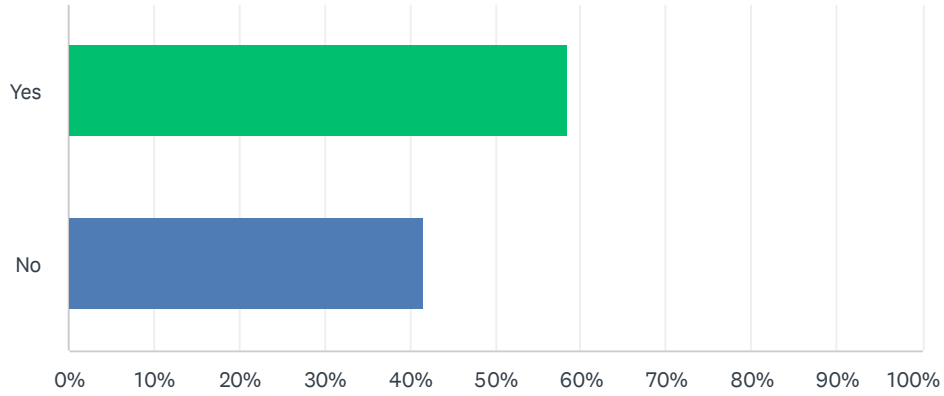

## Q9 Do you think taking classes online is preparing you for the next phase of your life?

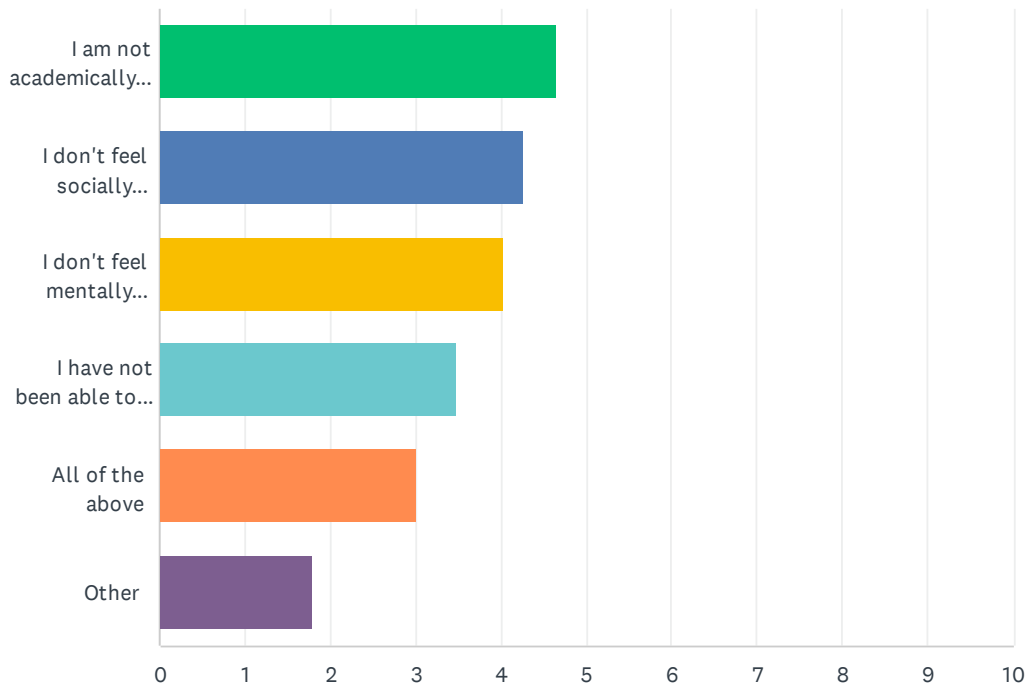

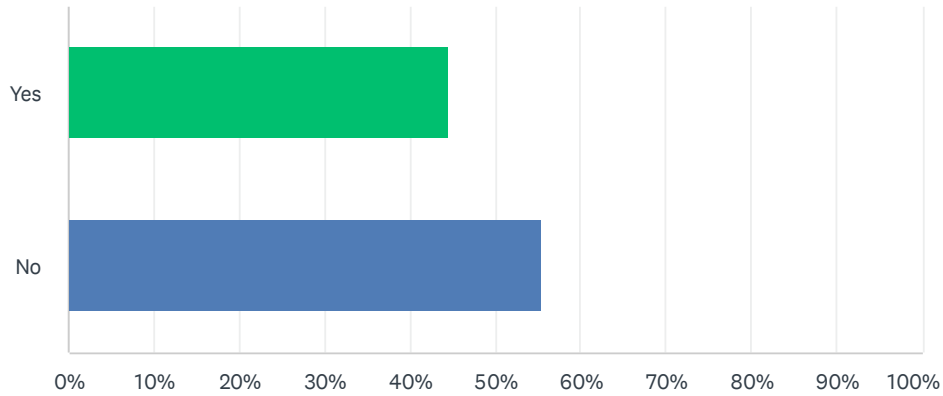

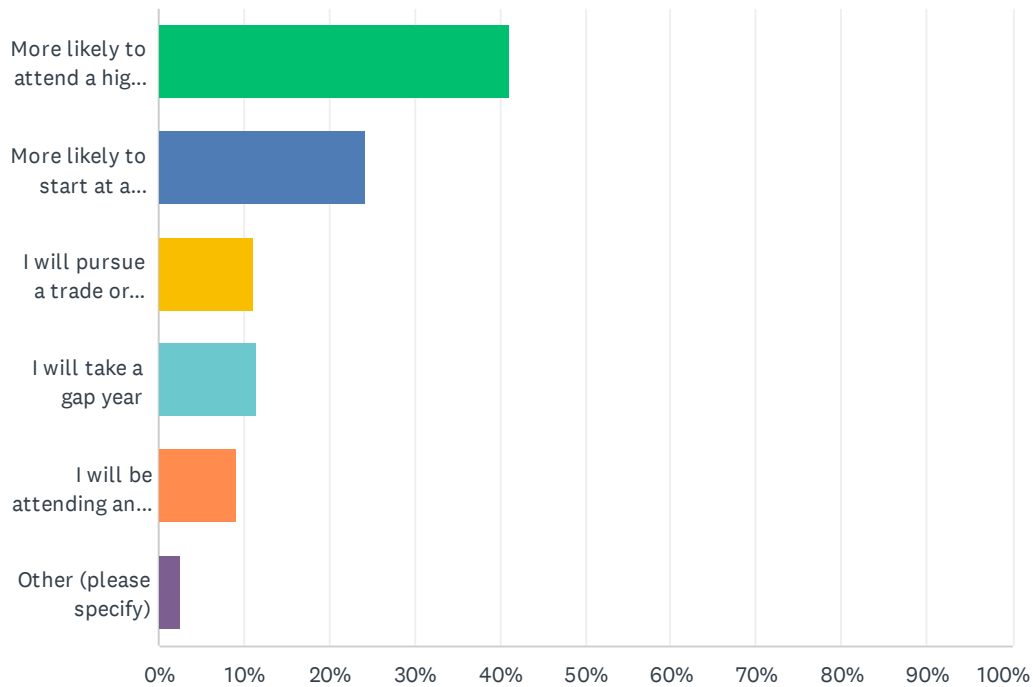

## Q14 Has economic uncertainty related to COVID-19 affected your plans?

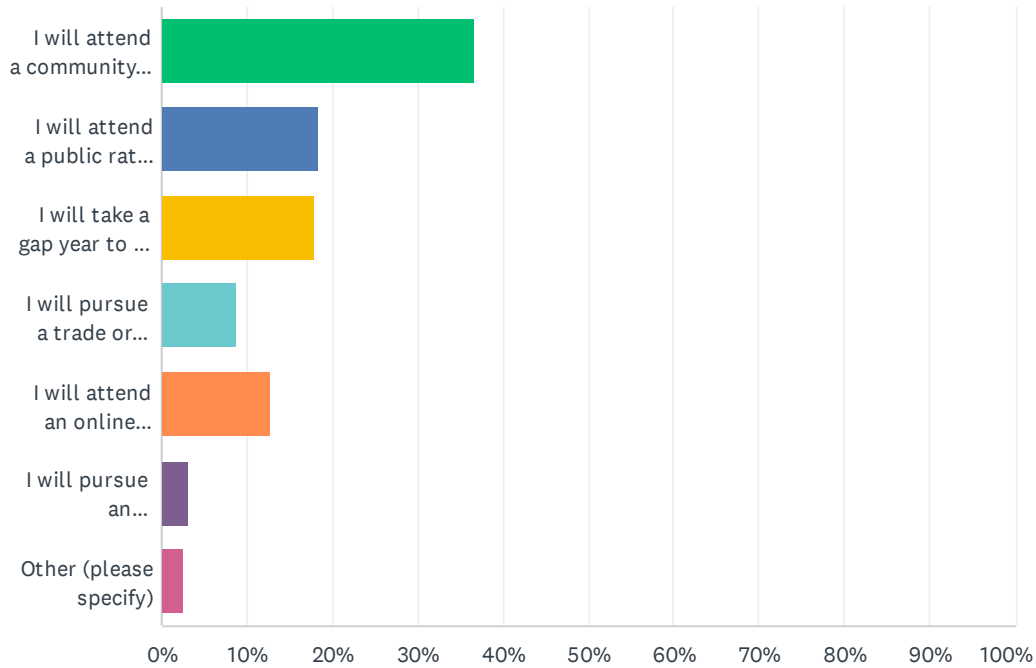

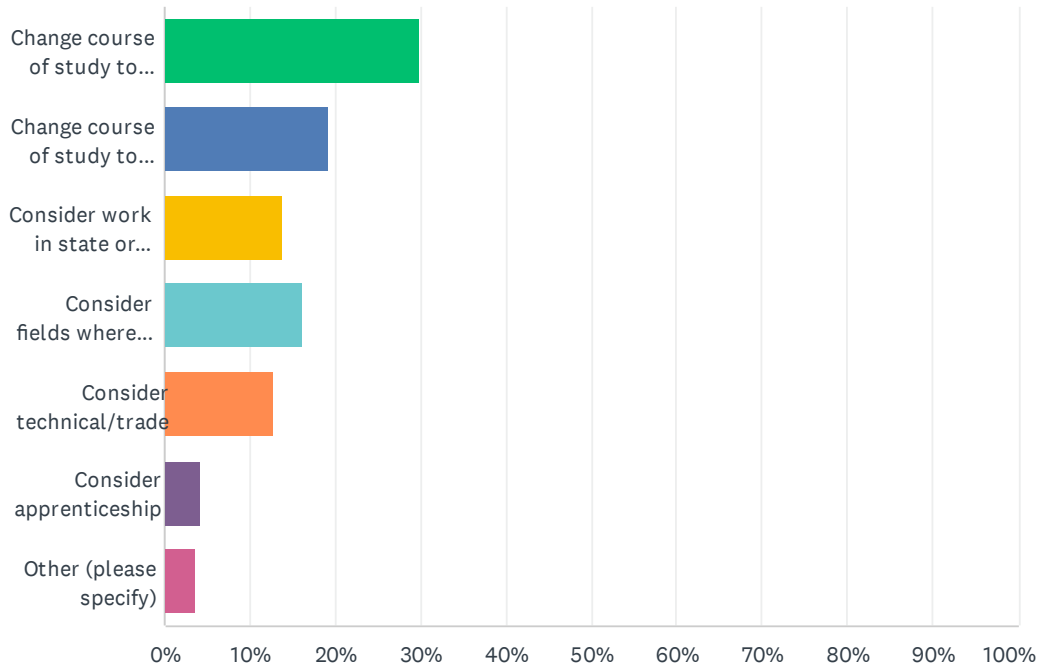

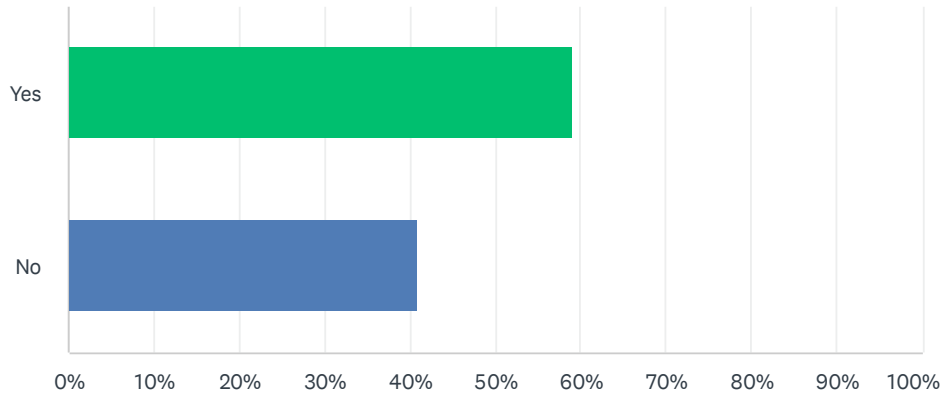

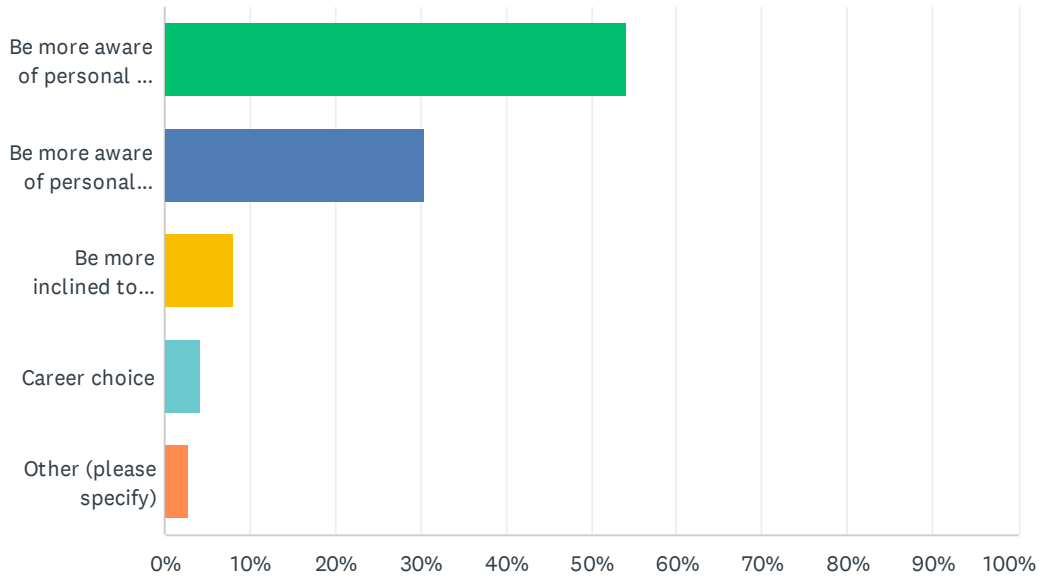

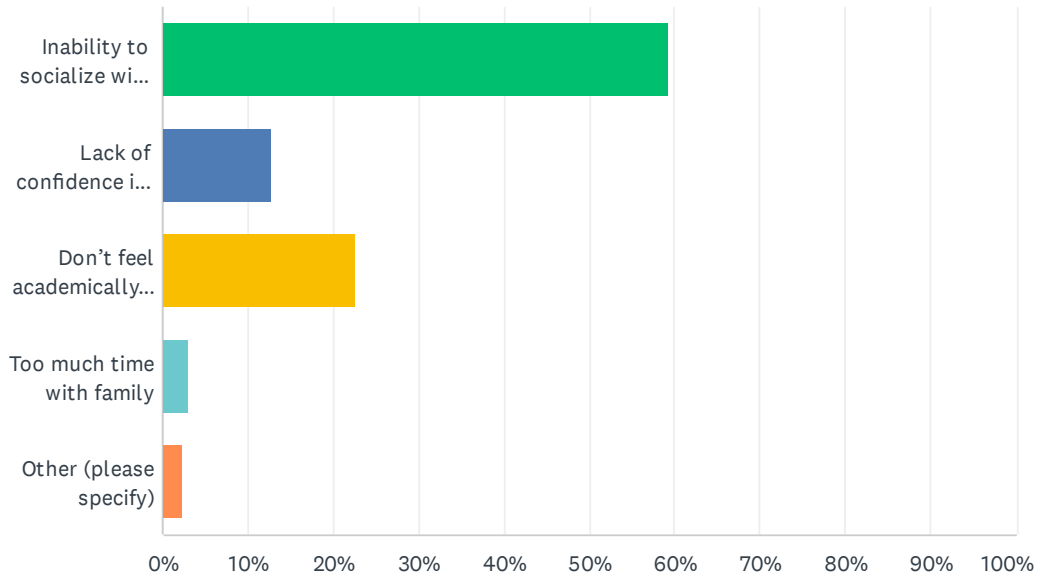

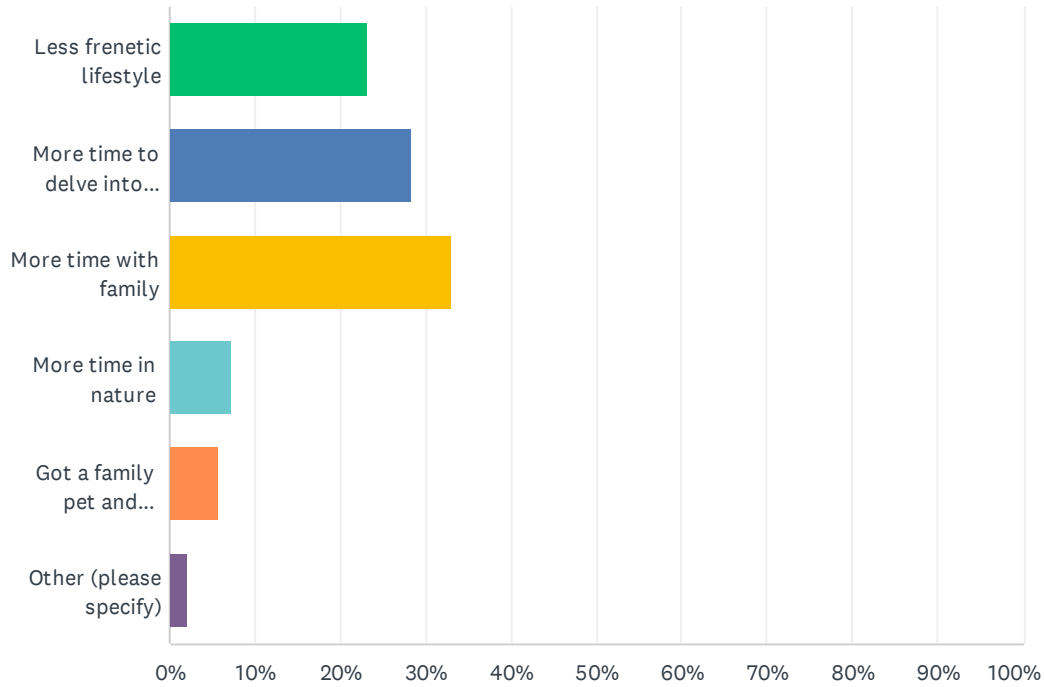

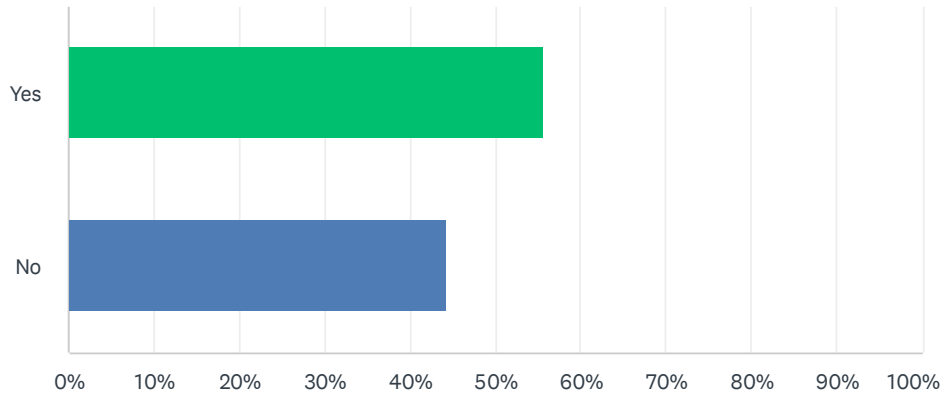

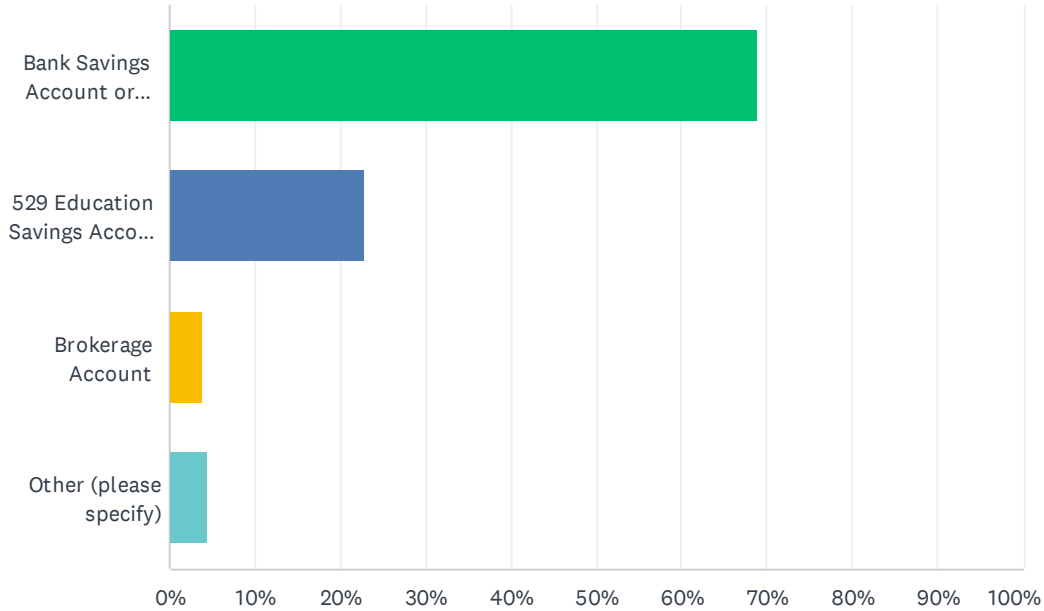

## Q27 Are your parents saving for your higher education?

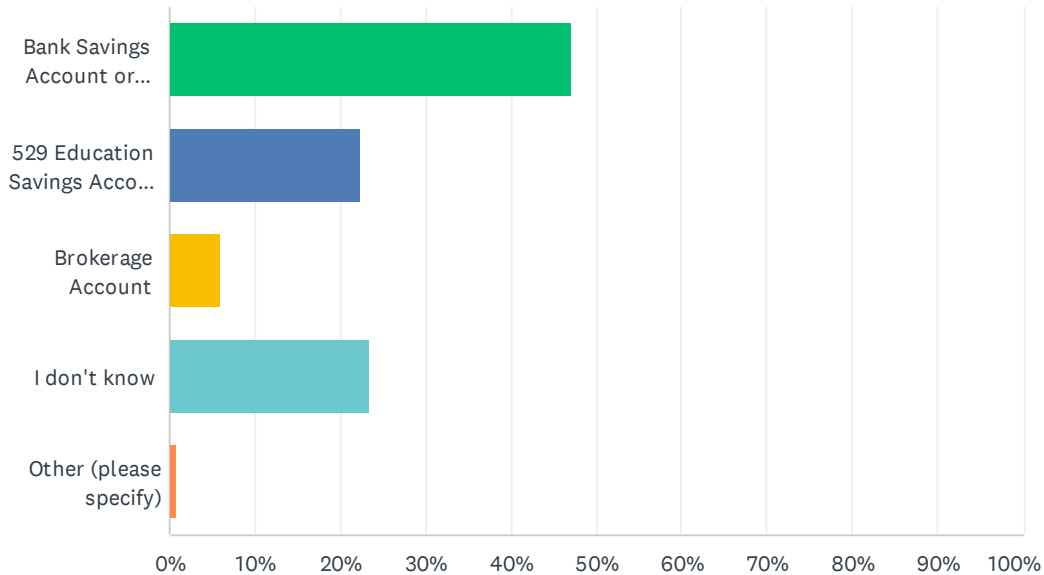

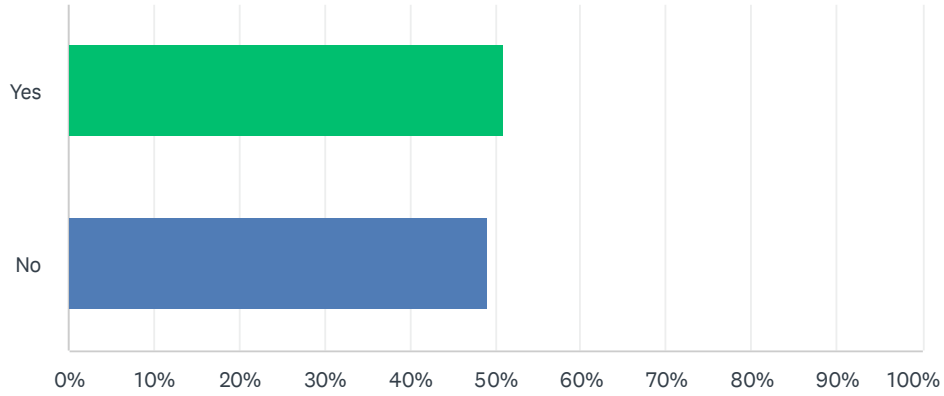

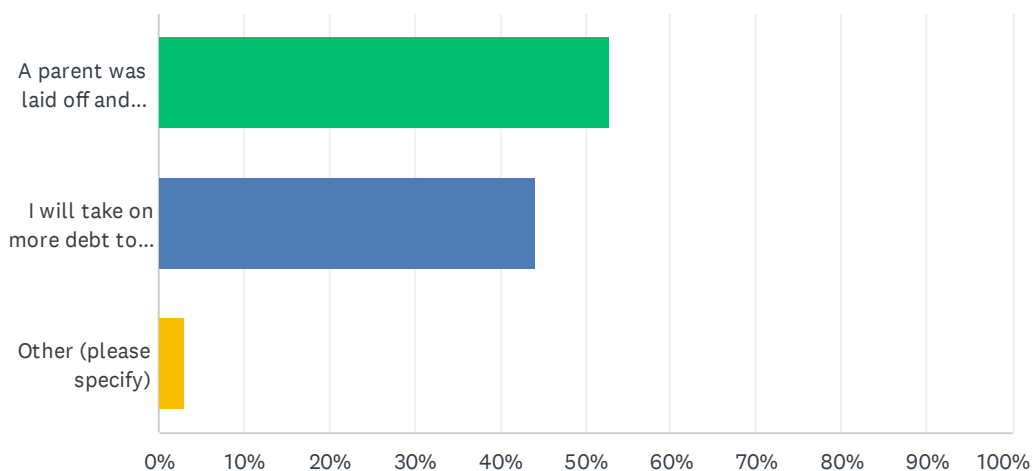

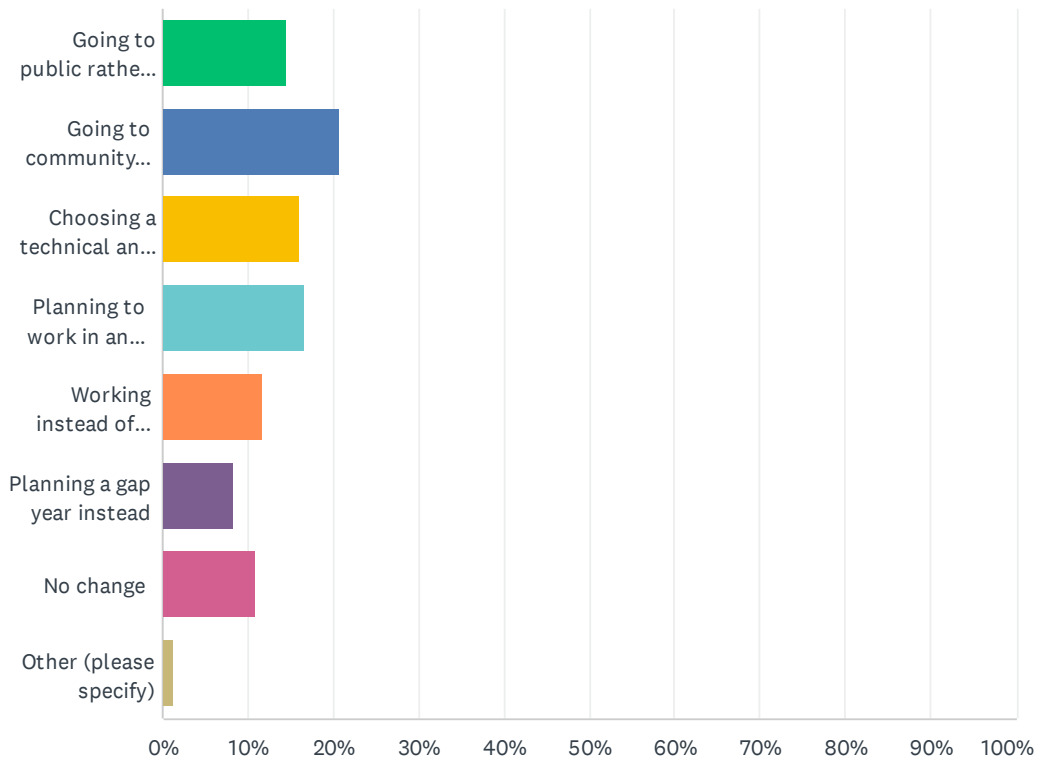
